



Seymore looking for offense to set tone for 2019

Of all the players from Demopolis who have moved on to the collegiate level over the past few years, the vast majority have been on the defensive side of the ball. The same holds true for last year's team. As such, the offense may have gained a little momentum and Coach Brian Seymore may see his offense set the tone this year.

In recent years, opposing teams have given the Tigers fits by being able to stack the box and put the brakes on the Tigers' formidable run game. After getting a year under his belt and working on mechanics and getting bigger and stronger, Peyton Stevenson has the skill set to make opposing defenses pay if they choose to stack the box. Rashaad Boone is set to continue the legacy of able running backs and wide receivers Shatarius Williams and Timothy Grayson will be there to keep defenses honest as down-field threats. Chandler King will see playing time at the tight end spot. Jaqualon Smith, Cole Wilson and Ben Ogden figure to be in the rotation, depending on the situation the Tigers find themselves in on offense. Also keep an eve out for Hayes Atkins to come in at quarterback when the Tigers find themselves in short yardage scenarios and for tempo changes.

Dalton Rowser, the only returning starting offensive lineman, will be the anchor at left tackle. Browder Braswell (left guard), Anthony Howerton (center), Charlie Singleton (right guard) and Andrew Thornton (right tackle) expect to step into the vacant slots to fill out the remainder of the offensive line.

Defensively, the Tigers will have a lesser experienced linebacking corps than previous seasons. Laquinton Wright (junior), Gray Sharpe


(sophomore), Mac Logan (junior) and Hayes Atkins (junior) will handle the duties at the second level. Avake Jones and Donald Means, Jr. look to hold down the defensive tackle spots while Alton Rowser anchors the middle at nose guard.

The secondary appears to be the strength of the defense to start the 2019 season. C.J. Williams, who holds D-I offers, is a talented cover corner. Should Williams need a rest, look for Matthew Witherspoon to step in. Jay Jones is set to handle the other corner spot and Cody Hinton should get some time there, too. Jim Lawler and Detron Essex are set to cover the middle, at the safety spots.

Special teams always play an important role and the Tigers need to be solid there this year to help gain an advantage whenever the opportunity comes their way. Malachi Simpson gets the nod for kickoff and PAT duties. We may see a punt-by-committee scenario, depending on the situation. Both quarterbacks, Stevenson and Atkins are joined by Dustin Bedwell at the punting position.

Keep an eye out for C.J. Williams. He can be a game changer and Seymore intends to continue to utilize his skills as a kick returner and add him to the offense on certain occasions. Shatarius Williams and Timothy Grayson can also be difference makers. Both are quite capable of making big plays.

Seymore's goal for the Tigers is to be the best version of themselves that they can be. The short term goal is to win the region, then make a deep run into the playoffs. The ultimate goal is always to make it to the championship. If the Tigers can avoid complacency, stay healthy and play as a team, they won't disappoint.



the excellence that Linden's players show, both on and off the field. Numbers-wise, the Patriots will field one of the smaller teams they have seen in the past few years. The current roster lists only 35 players. (Of those 35, juniors comprise at least half of the team.) Even in the years of larger squads, many are two way players, but that doesn't let anyone who isn't a starter off the hook. Fatigue or injury means you have to be ready when you are the next man up. And the Patriots always seem to be ready to answer the call. The Patriots will add some new faces and move some old faces to new places. Newcomer Jamarcus Williams has hit Lockett's radar and, at 5'11", 245 lbs., the junior is expected to be a huge asset on defense. Zelly Aldridge will be a first year starter at strong safety. Aldridge is a 6', 180 lb. junior who looks to have D-I talent and should make plays on both sides of the ball. Mekhel Miller will switch from his guard position to the fullback spot. Picking up some weight and speed in the offseason, Miller will now be looking for running room instead of making running room.

To go along with the new, we'll also see some of the "old." Johnny Blackmon continues his work at the wide receiver position, where he has been the starter for the past two years. Blackmon accounted for 500 receiving yards and six touchdowns last year. Douglas Johnson, who had 30 tackles for loss in 2018 and had 1400 yards rushing with 14 touchdowns, will be back. The Patriot defense is ready to rock

The Patriot defense is ready to rock and roll. Jamarcus Williams will fill

the middle at noseguard. Johnson and Daniels will provide support at the defensive end slots. Jacob Richardson (an all-state linebacker in 2018) and Mosley will protect the outside from their outside linebacker positions, while Miller and Semion Sims protect the middle of the second level. Tim Thurman and Aldridge have responsibility for the middle of the field at the free and strong safety spots. Joshua Williams (the 2019 Marengo County Student-Athlete of the Year) and Avion Flie will hold down the corners.

On the offensive side of things, Zackree Bishop will settle in for his senior year as the starter at quarterback. Bishop is no newcomer, as he is a three year starter on offense, and should have a handle on the scheme of things. Richardson will see the ball a lot from his running back position. Aldridge, Thurman, Williams and Blackmon headline a deadly wide receiver group that provide plenty of options for Bishop. The only question, at the moment, is the starting offensive line combination. Lockett is working to come up with the best unit to open up holes for his running backs and provide time for Bishop to find his receivers.

The Patriots have played a lot of good football over the past several years. For many, the 2018 season was supposed to be the Patriots' best chance at bringing a state title back to Linden. Unfortunately, the Patriots ran into a quite capable Mars Hill team at the championship game in Auburn. But, don't sell this small group short, by any means. These guys are tenacious, they are driven and they have been to the championship game. So, they know what they have to do to get back there and they know the road that leads them there.

Bulldogs look to get back to their winning ways

After a 14-1 season in 2017 yielded another state championship for the Sweet Water Bulldogs football program, the 2018 season wasn't quite as kind. The Dawgs did make it to the playoffs but ended the season at .500, which isn't exactly standard operating procedure in Sweet Water. After a taste of something other than winning, you can probably look for the Dawgs to be a little bit hungry in 2019.

The Bulldogs will have a little bit of adversity to overcome and will need to do it early. Numbers can always be an issue at a 1A school. Coach Pat Thompson has a roster that stops at number 38, so depth will be nipping at Thompson's heels all year. Six of his young pups, sophomores, will be called upon to join the ranks of the starters this season. Those six saw enough playing time that Thompson and the coaching staff feel good about putting them on the field to carry their share of the load.

The keys to the season will be things that are nothing new in Sweet Water - playing great defense and running the rock.


On the offensive side of the ball, senior Braiden Broussard returns as the starting quarterback for the 2019 season. With a year under his belt, the athletic Broussard will be better equipped to handle leading the Dawgs' offense. Jaland Lewis-Horton (sophomore) will get the nod at the fullback position and will be joined by the speedy Xavier Lucy at tailback and Jaylin Dixon at the wing back. Sasha Smith returns as an explosive deep threat at the wide receiver spot and Jaden Lewis will handle the tight end duties. Michael Alan Cole (a sophomore who has started for three

vears) and Devontae January will hold down the tackle positions, while proven leaders Quentin Dumas and Jakel Lewis protect the middle with Brodie Echols starting the show at center.

The unit tasked with stopping the opposing teams and handing the ball back to the offense will be anchored in the middle by sophomore Tyler Ward at the nose guard spot. The hard-to-block Willie Lewis will hold down one defensive tackle position, while Cole and January share time at the other tackle. The linebacking corps will have sophomores Trace Luker and Jamarlin Albert on the inside and Lewis-Horton and Walker Thompson patrolling the outside. Yes, all four starting linebackers are sophomores. Broussard and Smith will hold down the middle of the defensive backfield. Sullivan and Dixon will get the starts at the corners.

Keep an eye out for Antonio Sullivan, who will provide support at the receiver position. Lashon Young (freshman) should get some playing time at defensive back and wide receiver. Christian Dunning (sophomore) will see time at running back and defensive back. Ward and Albert will also get some time on the offensive line. Trent Smith should see action at wing back and Martez Dixon will contribute at linebacker.

As previously stated, the keys to success for the Bulldogs will be to play great defense and be able to consistently run the football effectively. The team needs to look forward, prepare and improve week by week. If the team can continue to steadily improve, the wins will take care of themselves.



Panthers look to build on 10 win season, make deeper playoff run

Over the last three seasons, the Marengo Panthers' win totals for the season have steadily risen. 2016 was a six win season. 2017 was a nine win season. And 2018 was a 10 win season. The Panthers have also made the playoffs the last four years. The 2018 season resulted in 10 wins and a trip into the second round of the playoffs. Head Coach Eberne Myrthil has crafted a winning culture in Dixons Mills and has a group of young men who understand what it takes to rise to the top and stay there.

The Panthers have a good mix of experience and youth should keep them at the top of their game. KeShawn Fountain returns for his second year at the helm of the Panther offense. Fountain accounted for 700+ yards of offense in his junior campaign and the Panthers are expecting bigger things of him during his senior year. DeAndre Pickett, coming in at 6, 300 lbs., will anchor the run game on offense. He will be expected to be one of the leaders to keep the offensive line up to its standard of dominance.

Senior Dominique Harris will be an important piece of the puzzle offensively and defensively. Harris takes over at the tight end position and will be the Panthers' signal caller on defense. He will be crucial to helping the Panthers' young core of linebackers work out the any kinks. Defensive end Ronald Bouler is a four year starter on the defensive and offensive lines. Bouler has been

a beast on defense, officially credited with 36 sacks over the last two seasons. (The Panthers are credited with 75.5 sacks over the last two seasons.)

For the Panthers' 2019 offensive set, joining quarterback Fountain in the offensive backfield will be halfback Deldrick Bouler and fullback Wellington Morrissette. Joining tight end Harris on the recieving corps will be wide receivers Almonte' Lewis and Nichalas Autery. Da'Myas Coleman and DeAndre Pickett will hold down the tackle spots. Anthony Hood and Ronald Bouler will fill the interior spots, with Jj'Quell Crispin at center.

On the defensive side of the ball, Ronald Bouler, Pickett, Trayon Watkins and Anthony Hood will look to continue the Panthers' dominance on the defensive line. Johnnie Jones, Morrissette and Harris will patrol the second level of the defense. Deldrick Bouler and Quincy Perry will handle the resposibilities at the cornerback positions, while Fountain works at free safety and Lewis checks in at the strong safety spot.

If the Panthers can carry the momentum of a 10-2 season a year ago over to this season, it should be fun to watch the Panthers play football this fall. They have an offense that can put points on the board (six 30+ point games) and a defense that can snuff out their opponents (five shutouts while allowing about nine points per game.
